

Sommer, SP Dover Plains, DOE 03/28/16, she was searched by Trooper Sommer. During this investigation it was learned that a fourth subject was developed who is Trooper Mark A. Sypek, SP Dover Plains, DOE 03/02/2015, who left in the SP Dover Plains interview room unattended and unsecured.	dle r to
Investigation revealed that on 07/26/18, Trooper Butenhoff was dispatched to the she arrived at the scene, Hyde Park for a report of a domestic dispute between a male and female. We she arrived at the scene, Hyde Park Police Department had two officers on the scene. It was learned that Ms was the subject of an active bench warrant out of SP Dover Plains. On 5/09/19, I was advised by Captain John Ryan Troop K BCI, that he had contacted Dutchess County Jail Captain William Moore on 5/02/19 for further clarification as to the extent of the strip search conducted during intake of Ms. The Dutchess County Jail and whether they ever made notification to NYSP when Ms. The Dutchess County Jail and whether they ever made was found in possession of contraband at the jail. Captain Ryan stated Dutchess County Jail Captain William Moore looked into the matter and advised him that he spoke with Correction Officer Krystal Lowe who stated to the best of her recollection, she strip searched the defendant, but only down to her underwear and she believes the defendant was allowed to retain her bra during and after booking. With respect to lack of notification to NYSP concerning the defendant's possession of contraband at the jail, Captain Moore stated NYSP was not notified because the contraband was found after the defendant was in with the general population. If the contraband was found during intake at the jail, then notification would have been made to NYSP.
CONCLUSION
Investigation revealed that Ms. was taken into custody for an active bench warrant out of SP Dover Plains for Criminal Possession of Stolen Property, by Trooper Butenhoff, SP Rhinebeck, while dispatched to a domestic complaint in the Town of Hyde Park. Trooper Butenhoff watched Ms. change her clothes from a tank top and shorts into a one piece "Romper" while wearing the same brassiere and underwear. She conducted a search of Ms. consistent with what is legally allowable as written in the Search and Seizure Laws of the State Of New York. Ms. was transported to Troop K Headquarters where she was transported to the custody of Trooper Sommer who also conducted a search of Ms. consistent with the allowable search previously performed by Trooper Butenhoff. Ms. was transported to SP Dover Plains for further processing. While at SP Dover Plains Investigator Obrien uncuffed Ms. and moved her to the interview room for the purpose of conducting an interview relating to a burglary investigation, Trooper Sypek assisted. Ms. was never secured while in the interview room. She was left unattended on three occasions while in SP Dover Plains interview room. While she was left unattended and unsecured Ms. could retrieve what appeared to be a needle from her brassiere and utilize same to inject an unknown substance into her body. Ms. was arraigned on an additional charge of Criminal Possession Stolen Property stemming from the burglary complaint. Ms. was arraigned before Town of Dover Honorable Justice John Fusco and remanded to the custody of the Dutchess County Jail in lieu of \$5000.00 cash and \$10,000.00 bond. Investigation into this matter regarding taking Ms. into custody and conducting a proper search of same by Trooper Sommer and Trooper Butenhoff revealed that Ms. was taken into custody for a Criminal Possession of Stolen Property bench warrant out of SP Dover Plains. Trooper Butenhoff observed Ms. change her clothing with the exception of her brassiere which she conducted a pat down of with her hand and did not find any contraband. Trooper Sommer conducted a similar search upon taking custody of Ms. The searches were consistent with what is required in Article 31E3, furthermore the Search and Seizure manual, page 16, requires that the search must be commensurate with the charge for which the defendant was arrested. In this incident the charge was not drug related or of the kind that would allow a strip search to locate contraband.
I recommend the matter concerning the search of Ms with regards Treaper Sammer and

I recommend the matter concerning the search of Ms. with regards Trooper Sommer and Trooper Butenhoff be Closed - Unfounded.

Investigation into this matter found that Investigator Obrien, Trooper Sommer and Trooper Sypek, repeatedly left Ms. unattended and unsecured while she was in their custody. This created ample opportunities for Ms. to retrieve a needle and an unknown substance and inject same into her body. Investigation determined that Investigator Obrien, Trooper Sommer and Trooper Sypek violated:

- Regulation 8A2 which requires all Members to study and comply with all Division Rules, Regulations, and Instructions.
- Regulation 8D-1 which states all members are responsible for the proper safeguarding of persons under arrest
- Executive Memorandum 05-09 that states prisoners should never be left unattended.

I recommend the matter of Regulation 8A2, Regulation 8D1 and Executive Memorandum 05-09 with regard to Investigator Obrien, Trooper Sommer and Trooper Sypek, be Closed- Founded, and the appropriate administrative action be taken.

I have been directed to submit this memorandum under Article 16.2(A) of the agreement between the State of New York and the NYSPIA concerning the performance of my official duties and that I am required to provide this memorandum. I have been offered representation, to which I am entitled during an interrogation pursuant to Article 16.2(b)(7) and submit this memorandum accordingly. I understand that a refusal to provide this memorandum or a failure to provide a truthful account may result in disciplinary action against me, up to and including the termination of my employment.

On July 26, 2018 I was working a scheduled "B" tour, assigned to SP Dover Plains.

While at the barracks I monitored a radio transmission indicating a prisoner was being relayed to SP Dover Plains. I was advised by SP Dover Plains UF patrols that transported to SP Dover Plains to be processed on an active bench warrant out of the Town of Dover. was a suspect in an ongoing burglary investigation being conducted by I was aware that Investigator Adam Pereiro, Trooper Jacalyn M. Sommer arrived at SP Dover Plains with While I was in the backroom at SP Dover Plains I reviewed the case file for SJS familiarize myself with the particulars of the case. I entered the patrol room where I observed in handcuffs and Trooper Sommer seated at a desk. I approached Trooper Sommer and had been searched to which she replied in the affirmative. I instructed Trooper Sommer to wait until I left the room, then read her New York State Police Miranda Warning. I asked Trooper Mark A. Sypek to join me in the interview for the purpose of having another member present while interviewing a female suspect, as well as to allow Trooper Sypek to gain experience interviewing a suspect.

I brought from the patrol room to the interview room of SP Dover Plains where I had already activated the Liberty recording system. Trooper Sypek joined me in the interview room, and I questioned on her involvement in the burglary that was being investigated in SJS

During the course of the interview Trooper Sypek and I exited the interview room at which point I closed the door and discussed the interview with Trooper Sypek and I went back into the backroom of SP Dover Plains to further review details of the case file. A short time later Trooper Sypek and I went back into the interview room and continued the interview. admissions to knowingly possessing stolen property. I asked if she would provide a written statement and she replied in the affirmative. I then exited the interview room with Trooper Sypek. Immediately upon leaving the room the second and final time I asked Trooper Sommer to accompany to the bathroom and I then asked Trooper Sypek to take a written statement from then entered the backroom and began to prepare paperwork for her arrest. Judge Fusco remanded to Dutchess County Jail in lieu of \$5,000 cash or \$10,000 bond. Trooper Sommer transported from Dover Court to Dutchess County Jail.
